1. HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY

SkyQuest is committed to fostering an inclusive and supportive environment where all students feel welcomed, connected, and confident in pursuing their academic goals. We take the health, safety, and well-being of our students seriously and offer a range of support services and resources to ensure their success and peace of mind. a) MENTAL HEALTH

OBJECTIVE: To proactively identify mental health issues, address them effectively, and ensure that all students are aware of and have access to relevant support services. We recognize that challenges related to mental health can affect international students in unique ways, and we are committed to providing necessary assistance and resources.
